

Let the children come

I don't imagine I am the only one to be distressed by what we have heard and seen on the news this week. Gaza! No adult should be subjected to the fierce actions of both sides in the dispute, and the thought of children cowering away from explosions, fires, falling masonry and gunfire is intolerable. I want to call a halt to it all, but am impotent to do anything about it.

Here in Wesley we have Messy Church, and a group also goes into local primary schools with Open the Book, presenting bible truths in an accessible form. Each week in term time we have Jack-in-a-Box for the little ones. We seek to raise funds for Action for Children, the Methodist charity supporting children and giving them a foundation for their lives. Meanwhile in the Middle East generations of children - survivors from the devastation - are learning the lesson that we must seek ways of avenging what others done to us. Thus we perpetuate violent ways of behaving towards our neighbours.

Much that is wrong in our world lies beyond our ability to change it. That makes it even more important for us to do the little that is within our power. Let's do whatever we can to help in the vital task of nurturing and protecting our children.

In this week's lectionary reading we remember the teaching of Jesus, and his words about bringing in the children and nurturing them. We should also recognise the work done by those here and in other places in serving children, and be glad of them, offering our support in any way we can. "Let the children come."
